The only exceptions are mothers with young children and anyone with physical handicaps which would preclude their involvement. Anyone excused from participating in Wilderness Trails & Urban Impact will participate in our PATH Mini-Trails. If you have questions about this, please talk it over with the PATH leadership prior to arrival.



### *Wilderness Trails*

Wilderness Trails is a valuable part of PATH. It consists of a series of unfamiliar problems which must be solved by participants in an unfamiliar setting with the aid of unfamiliar coworkers. We have found that this experience will help you learn much about yourself and your attitudes toward life. Wilderness Trails are led by well qualified staff who is experienced in

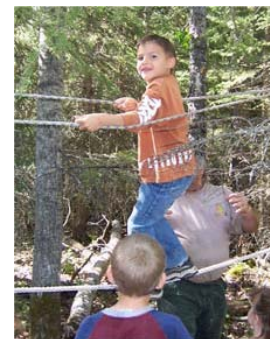


this program. All equipment will be furnished, but you will need appropriate clothing and footwear.

### *Mini-Trails*

Mini-Trails is a companion to the Wilderness Trails designed for those (primarily expecting mothers and mothers with young children) who will not be participating in the above described Wilderness Trails. It is a lively day-to-day adventure that captures the principles that are taught in Wilderness Trails. It is geared for young children to be able to participate and have fun. The principle of learning to work together harmoniously as a team is also emphasized. Mini-Trails takes place on or around the Timber Bay Bible Center grounds and requires no special equipment. Meals are provided in the dining hall.



### *Urban Impact*

Urban Impact is an elective alternative to Wilderness Trails/Mini-Trails. It is designed to provide additional understanding and training for missionaries who will encounter the unique ministry challenges of working among Native people who have migrated to urban centers. Urban Impact will take place in the center of the Native community in Regina, Saskatchewan. It will expose the participants to a number of situations, complications, and frustrations that most often are faced by a Native person existing in an urban setting. Entire families may participate in Urban Impact.

*A minimal number of participants are needed to make this option feasible.*
